# **Questions about the closure:**

### Why is Crosslands Surgery closing?

The Partners of Leeds City Medical Practice have always had the long-term ambition of purchasing and redeveloping the Crossland surgery site. We received approval to do this mid-2022. As the country recovers from covid, the costs of materials and redevelopment have escalated to such levels that this plan is no longer viable. We have informed the current owners of the building that we will not be proceeding with the purchase of the building, and they have subsequently given notice to the practice to vacate by 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

#### What will happen to the building?

The building is privately owned and the owners have put it on the market. The future use of the building will be dependent on the outcome of this sale.

# **Questions about registering:**

#### I am a patient at Crossland Surgery, what will this mean for me?

All our patients are registered with Leeds City Medical Practice regardless of what site they tend to use or where they originally registered. All patients can access all the practice's services we deliver at our Parkside and Beeston Hill sites as they do now.

# **Questions about changes to services:**

Will the opening hours change?

No, our practice is open: Monday – Friday, 8am – 6pm

You will also be able to get routine evening and weekend appointments through the extended access service as you can now.

Note we do close one afternoon a month, usually 10 months of the year for training as agreed with the NHS. These closure dates are published on our website. If you would like a list of the planned dates, please call and ask the practice – **0113 467 7500**.

#### Will any services change?

There are no planned changes to any services. You can access everything as you do now.

With the extra space we plan to use at Parkside we are hoping that we will be able to develop and offer more services locally to our patients in collaboration with other local practices and NHS services.
